CAVENDISH ROAD

To the late Colonel J. Hill, then Director of Secondary Education, the school owes the selection of its site. It is splendidly situated near the top of a rising slope commanding a view extending from Mt. Gravatt across the city to the distant Western Hills. At the high end of the grounds, is the Girl's Area of green lawns and shady trees known as See Park. The School buildings, ten in number, cover a vast acreage and have that casual air of having grown up from seed scattered broadcast. If split levels are the fashion, then Cavendish Road is ultra modern.

There are many features of the School that can be regarded with justifiable pride. It is one of the few Queensland Schools with all three branches of Cadet Units—Army, Navy, and Air Force. It has its own Pipe Band. It has an extensive reading library with two fine murals, one depicting "The Cavendish Legend," the other, "The Sands of Time", these being the work of students under the direction of the Art Mistress. The well-equipped and efficiently run School Canteen provides facilities and service to Students and Staff.

Cavendish Road was the first of the perimeter high schools. It set the pattern which other schools were to follow. From its modest beginning in February, 1952 with an enrolment of only 30, it has become one of the largest and most highly respected schools in Queensland, a school with a tradition almost legendary. Throughout these eleven years, the kindly and wise direction of its Principal, has been the moving force.
