State Scholarships are granted to those candidates who secure passes in the State Scholarship Examination held in November, 1960. 50% or above constitutes a Pass.

This result sheet may be presented by a successful candidate as an authority to seek admission to any approved Secondary School in Queensland.

A Scholarship holder's attendance must begin at the commencement of a school term, and it is to be understood that a Scholarship may be withdrawn if the Scholarship holder's attendance is not regular and punctual and his/her diligence and conduct are not satisfactory.

The Principal of the school attended is required to furnish at the end of each term, a certificate as to each Scholarship holder's attendance, diligence, and conduct during that term.

The currency of a State Scholarship is two years. A Scholarship gained in December, 1960, terminates on the 31st December, 1962,

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE GRANTING OF THE SCHOLARSHIP ALLOWANCE

1. A Scholarship allowance is paid on behalf of those Scholarship holders the income of whose parents does not exceed the Basic Wage plus £50 for each child entirely dependent, or an amount equal to one-fifth of the Basic Wage per member of family entirely dependent on such income whichever is the greater.

The Scholarship Allowance will be —

- (a) £16 per annum in the case of a Scholarship holder who can live at home and attend an approved Secondary School.
- (b) £65 First and Second Years, in the case of Scholarship holders who are compelled to live away from home in order to attend an approved Secondary School.

These allowances will be granted for that portion of the currency of the Scholarship during which the income of the parents or guardians does not exceed the amount prescribed.

2. A State Scholarship holder's attendance at an approved Secondary School must commence at the beginning of a school term.

3. A State Scholarship holder who desires to be considered in respect of a Scholarship Allowance must submit a claim on an "Application for Allowance" form, No. E.D./714, addressed to the Director-General of Education, immediately on receipt of the notification of success, if action in this matter has not already been taken. A supply of the necessary forms was forwarded to the Head Teacher of the School attended at the time that Candidates' Distinguishing Number Slips were despatched.

It is to be understood that an application for the award of a Scholarship Allowance will apply for a period of one year only. Should the continuance of the allowance be desired for the second year of the Scholarship, a further application must be made. A supply of "Application for Allowance" forms will be forwarded to the Principals of all approved Secondary Schools about June, 1961, to enable such Scholarship holders as desire to do so to claim a Scholarship Allowance for the year 1962.

TUITION FEES

Scholarship holders are entitled to receive two years free tuition at any State High School or State School with a Secondary Department.

On behalf of those Scholarship holders who attend an approved Secondary School other than a State institution, the Department of Education will pay to the Principal of that school tuition fees as under —

Sub-Junior and Junior Years £18 per annum for Males and Females
